### **National Transportation Safety Board**

The NTSB is an independent federal agency charged with investigating and determining the probable cause of all civil aviation accidents in the United States and selected accidents in rail, highway, marine and pipeline operations.

The NTSB's Transportation Disaster Assistance Division (TDA) coordinates the resources of federal, state, and local agencies, transportation operators and the American Red Cross, in order to meet the needs of family members and survivors. TDA also serves as the primary resource for investigative information for family members and survivors. The TDA website offers information, resources and referrals for survivors and their families.

## U.S. Department of Justice Office for Victims of Crime

When an MVI occurs, the OVC website provides helpful information on a designated web page to victim assistance professionals, victims/survivors and first responders about resources that can help them recover physically, emotionally and financially.

OVC also administers the U.S. Department of Justice Anti-terrorism and Emergency Assistance Program (AEAP) to support jurisdictions that have experienced incidents of terrorism or mass violence through the provision of grants for crisis response, consequence management, criminal justice support, and training and technical assistance. The AEAP website provides information about its solicitation process and FAQs about applying for AEAP support.
